Overall Goals of the child

- 1) To learn to accept school and feel safe away from home.
- 2) To develop a sense of SELF.
- 3) To learn to share, communicate, and get along with classmates.
- 4) To strengthen muscles and coordination of the body.
- 5) To learn to listen and begin building vocabulary such as speaking single words and phrases.

Areas of Concentration Math/Number Concepts

- 2) Exploring the use of cars, trains, traffic signs, etc.

Toys/Manipulatives

- 1) Use of various educational toys
- 2) Puzzles and Games
- 3) Sorting

Fine Motor Skills

- 1) Lacing blocks and beads
- 2) Lacing Cards with pictures to reinforce the letters of the alphabet, shapes, numbers, colors etc.
- 3) Tracing large figure letters, shapes, numbers, etc.
- 4) Coloring freehand or large pre-printed pictures and gradually advancing to pictures with smaller parts
- 5) Tearing or cutting paper and pasting
- 6) Finger plays
- 7) Interacting with table-top toys and other manipulative materials

Visual Discrimination

- 1) Observing and analyzing large visual figures to distinguish differences (such as emphasizing number of sides, corners, length comparisons, etc.)
- 2) Counting objects using manipulative materials
- 3) Using flash cards to enforce recognition of letters, shapes, objects, numbers, etc.

Gross Motor Skills

- 1) Interaction of various games
- 2) Body action exercises, rhymes, finger plays, dancing and songs
- 3) Use of outdoor equipment to enforce large muscle activity
- 4) Yoga
